

Military medical workers to offer free healthcare to Tri-State

Around 200 medical professionals serving in the U.S. military are providing free medical care for anyone who needs it. Reservists and active-duty individuals will set up a makeshift clinic at **South Middle School in Henderson, Kentucky, from June 15-25.**

There are no residency requirements, and anyone 3 or older can get treatment.

Services provided:

Basic medical and wellness exams

Physicals

Nutrition advice

Vision exams

The making of eyeglasses on-site

Dental exams, as well as sealants, fillings and extractions

Two days of limited veterinary services, including wellness checks and vaccines for dogs and cats

The clinic will be open every day except for Saturday, June 22. Its hours fluctuate depending on the day, usually running from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. or 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. On two days, June 21 and June 25, it will be open from 8 a.m. to noon. The vet clinic at the fairgrounds, meanwhile, will operate June 23-24 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
